Executive Summary

The Bluford Healthcare Leadership Institute (BHLI) is an intense professional development program designed to mentor, coach, and sponsor talented undergraduate scholars for healthcare leadership who will serve to eliminate disparities in healthcare. The Institute incorporates the dynamic business and healthcare community of Kansas City, MO while leveraging the national reputation of its president and founder, John W. Bluford, III, to expose the participating scholars to mentors, experiences, and internship opportunities unique to this Institute. The BHLI enhances the scholars' knowledge, understanding, and practice of the key leadership traits increasingly required of leaders in the 21st century healthcare environment.

Phase I:

- Phase I of the 2025 Bluford Healthcare Leadership Institute was held in Kansas City, MO from Wednesday, May 14 through Thursday, May 29.
- Students were recruited through a joint effort between BHLI staff and school officials from the leadership, scholarship, honors, and career placement programs of partnering universities. Interested students were required to possess a minimum GPA of 3.2 and possess demonstrated leadership skills. Each student was required to submit an official copy of his/her college transcript, two professional letters of recommendation, and an essay outlining career goals and interest in the BHLI.
- The 2025 Cohort of the BHLI was comprised of students recruited from the following universities and colleges: Claflin University, College of Charleston, Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University, Hampton University, Loyola University, Morehouse College, North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, Spelman College, and University of Missouri-Kansas City.

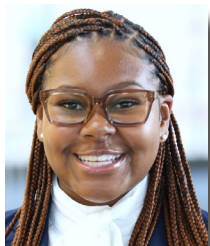
Jada Gorgor

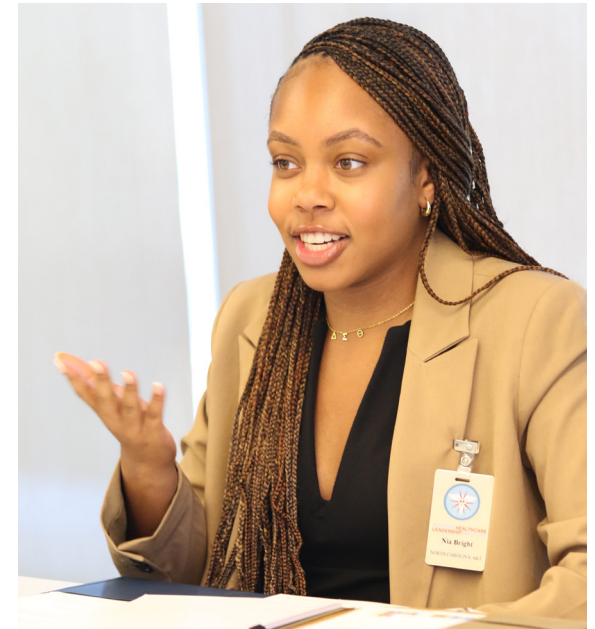

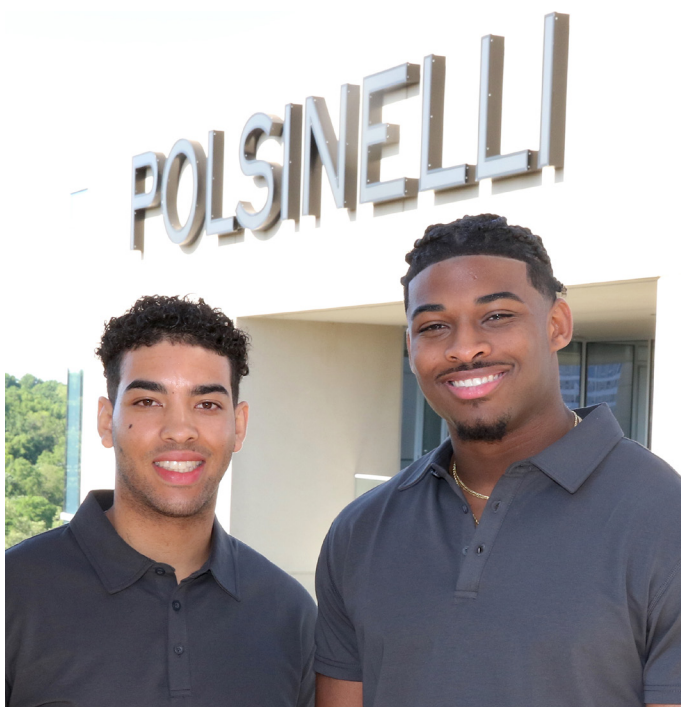

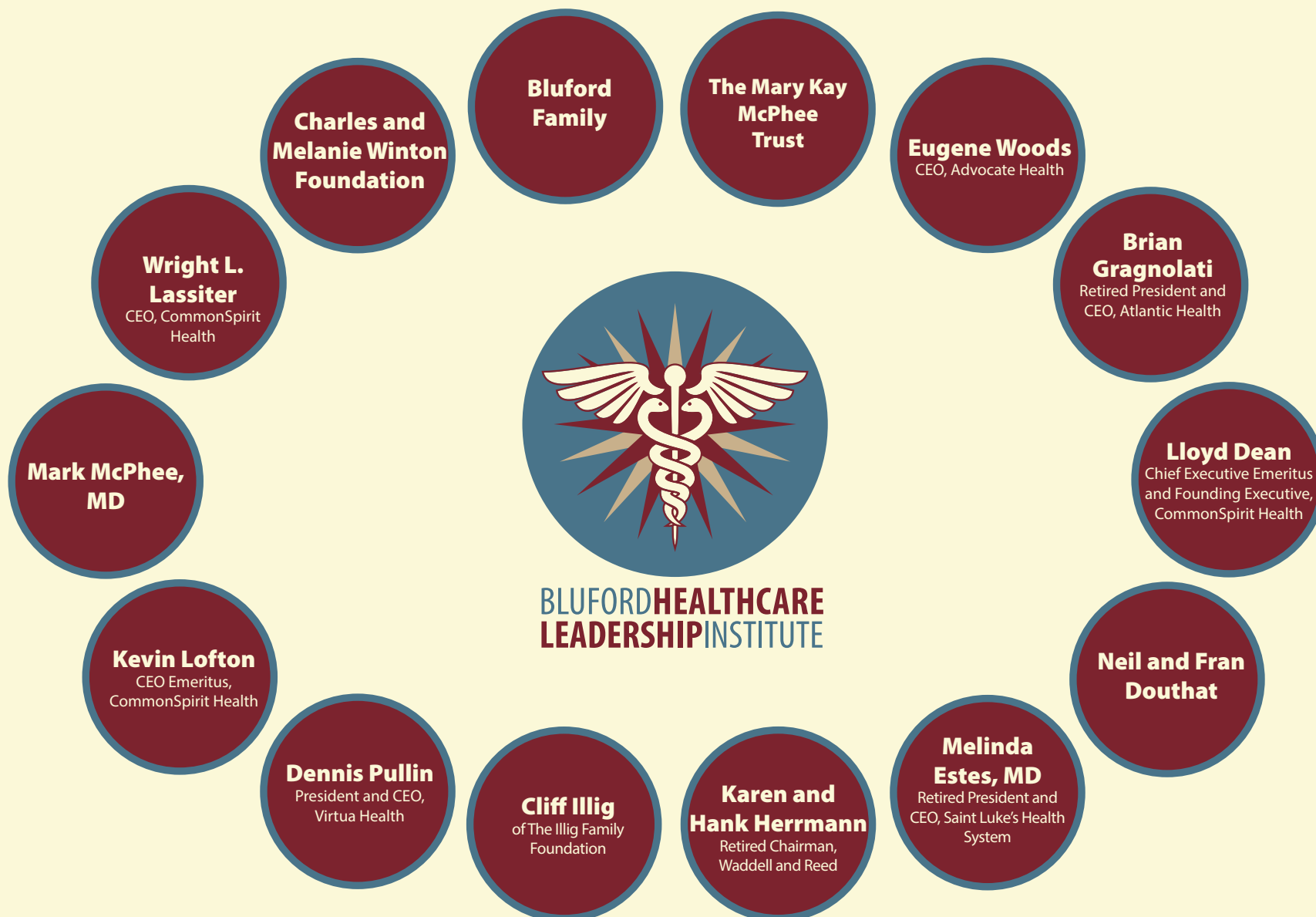
